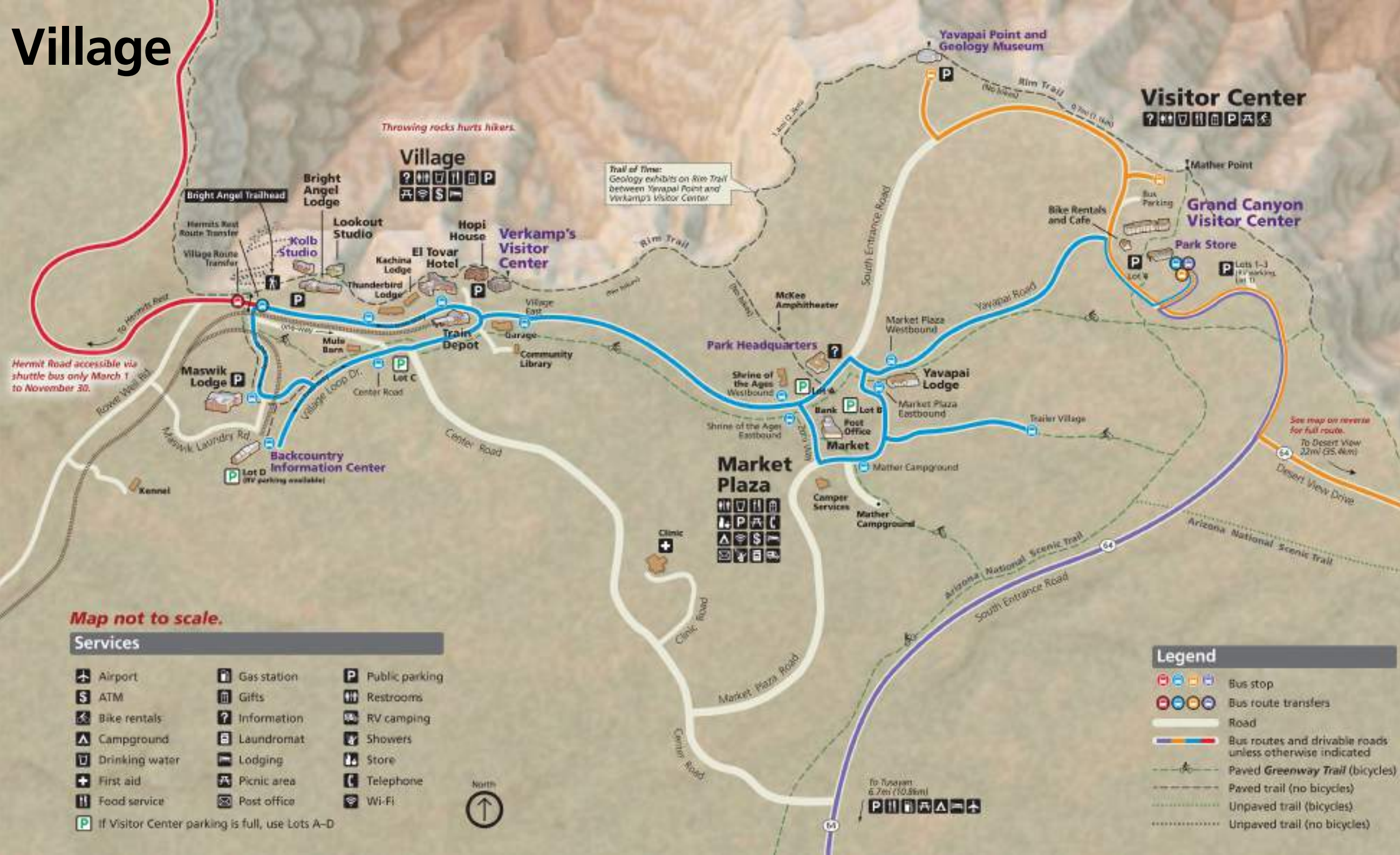

Free Shuttle Buses

Shuttle Bus Information

Hours of Operation

The Village, Kaibab/Rim, and Hermits Rest Route shuttle buses run every 10–15 minutes during the day. They run approximately every 30 minutes beginning the hour before sunrise and ending the hour after sunset. The Tusayan Route shuttle bus runs every 20 minutes starting at 8 am at IMAX and ends at 9:45 pm.

Bus Rules

- No eating or open drink containers.
- No pets. ADA-approved service animals only.
- Accommodates wheelchairs 30 inches (76 cm) wide by 48 inches (121 cm) long; larger chairs do not fit on buses.
- Collapse strollers before entering the shuttle bus. No oversized or jogging strollers. Remove baby-back carriers when seated.
- Shuttle buses can accommodate two or three bicycles but not tag alongs, baby trailers, or children's bicycles with wheels less than 16 inches (41 cm). Riders must load and unload their bicycles.
- Shuttle buses only stop at designated bus stops.

Hiking Information

Many believe they are strong hikers and a hike into the canyon is easy. Know your limits.

Before hiking into the canyon please seek advice from a park ranger. Ask for a hiking brochure at visitor contact stations. More in-depth information about specific trails, conditions, and smart hiking practices can be found at the Backcountry Information Center.

Free, Daily Park Ranger Programs

Join a park ranger for free, daily walks, talks, hikes, demonstrations, and evening programs. Learn about geology, fossils, plants, animals, people, and more! Look for programs for children ages 6–14 during summer. Check visitor centers or go.nps.gov/gc_programs.

Protect the Park, Protect Yourself

Beat the Heat! Use free water filling stations, wear sunblock, and rest in the shade. The South Rim's high elevation and dry climate may adversely affect you.

When Thunder Roars, Go Indoors! Stay away from exposed areas. Seek shelter in a building or vehicle. Do not go under a tree. Be prepared for any type of weather: rain, snow, wind, or sun. In winter, trails and walkways may be icy. Wear over-the-shoe traction devices. Road and weather conditions: 928-638-7496.

Write a postcard, not graffiti. Flying unmanned aircraft (drones) is illegal.

Leashed pets are allowed on Rim and Greenway trails, but not below the rim, in buildings, or on shuttle buses. These limits do not apply to ADA-approved service animals. Check in at the Backcountry Information Center if you plan to hike in the canyon.

Keep Wildlife Wild! For your safety and theirs, please: Keep a distance of two bus lengths, do not give water or food, and drive carefully.

Advice to Enjoy Grand Canyon

- Ride the Free Shuttle Buses!**
- Arrive every 10–15 minutes
 - Four bus routes: Kaibab/Rim Route (orange), Village Route (blue), Hermits Rest Route (red), Tusayan Route (purple)

- I have 1–2 hours. What should I do?**
- Walk the Rim Trail 1–1.5 miles (1.6–2.4 km)
 - Ride the Kaibab/Rim Route (orange)

- I have a half day. What should I do?**
- Walk along the Rim Trail between Grand Canyon Visitor Center and the Village (2.5 mi/4 km) one way
 - Ride the Hermits Rest Route (red). Tip: ride this shuttle in the morning to avoid crowds.
 - Drive to Desert View Watchtower

- I have a full day. What should I do?**
- Attend free park ranger programs
 - Visit free park museums and visitor centers
 - Hike into Grand Canyon (go to a visitor center for information)

Parking Near Shuttle Bus Stops

Backcountry Information Center Lot D; auto parking in north lot; RV and trailer parking in south lot; fills by 2 pm

Grand Canyon Visitor Center Lot 1 offers auto, RV, and trailer parking; autos only in Lot 2, Lot 3, and Lot 4; lots fill by 11 am

Market Plaza Lot B; autos and RVs; fills by noon

Park Headquarters Lot A; vehicles less than 22 feet (6.7 m) only; fills by noon

Village Lot C; autos only; extremely limited parking for autos throughout Village; fills by 2 pm

Yavapai Geology Museum Small lot with auto parking

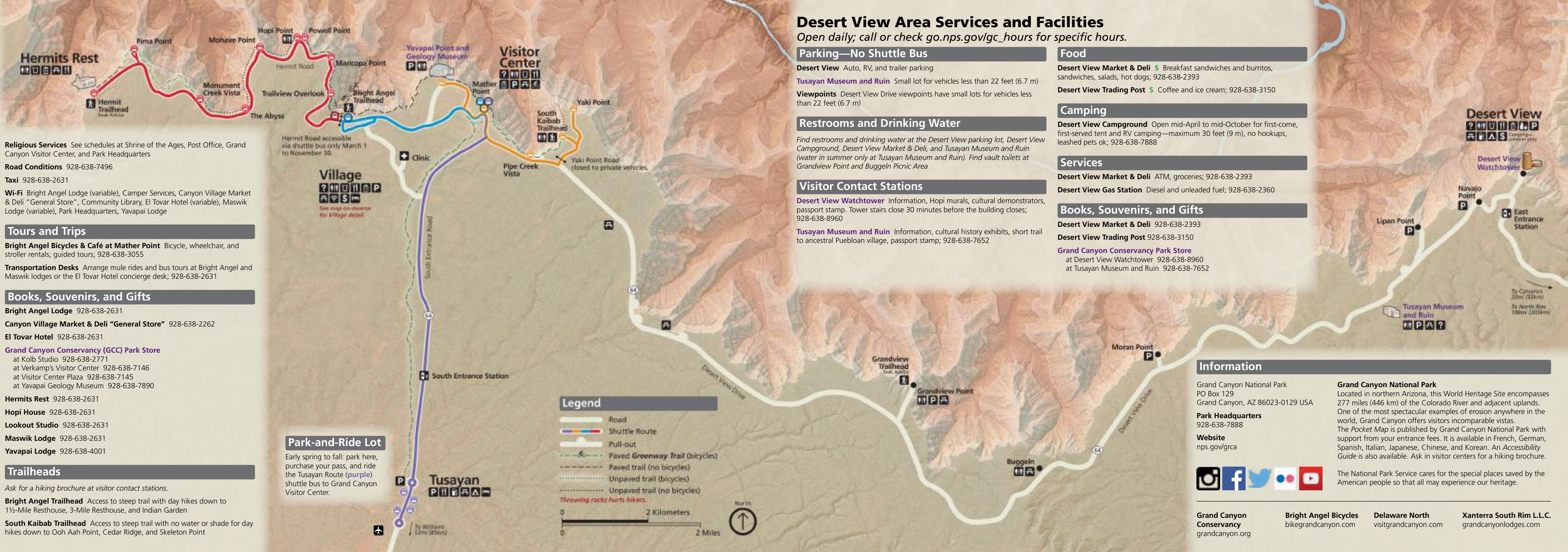

Ask for a hiking brochure at visitor contact stations.

Bright Angel Trailhead Access to steep trail with day hikes down to 1½-Mile Resthouse, 3-Mile Resthouse, and Indian Garden

South Kaibab Trailhead Access to steep trail with no water or shade for day hikes down to Ooh Aah Point, Cedar Ridge, and Skeleton Point

Park-and-Ride Lot

Early spring to fall: park here, purchase your pass, and ride the Tusayan Route (purple) shuttle bus to Grand Canyon Visitor Center.

Grand Canyon National Park
Located in northern Arizona, this World Heritage Site encompasses 277 miles (446 km) of the Colorado River and adjacent uplands. One of the most spectacular examples of erosion anywhere in the world, Grand Canyon offers visitors incomparable vistas. The *Pocket Map* is published by Grand Canyon National Park with support from your entrance fees. It is available in French, German, Spanish, Italian, Japanese, Chinese, and Korean. An *Accessibility Guide* is also available. Ask in visitor centers for a hiking brochure.
